

CHECKLIST FOR GUIDE DOGS AND ASSISTANCE DOGS IN THE UNITED KINGDOM

The following checklist will ensure that your trip goes smoothly; have a good read before setting off:

PASSPORT AND VACCINATIONS	<p>Always check that your guide dog's passport and vaccinations are valid.</p> <p>See the following web site to verify the required vaccinations: https://www.gov.uk/take-pet-abroad</p>	<input type="checkbox"/>
VETERINARY CHECKS	<p>Remember to arrange the mandatory TAPEWORM–CESTODA vaccination (to be given between one and five days before the dog travels).</p> <p>Make sure that your dog is in good health to cope with the trip.</p> <p>We recommend a trip to the vet's as a precautionary measure.</p>	<input type="checkbox"/>
CERTIFICATES	<p>When booking the flight, keep your guide dog's or assistance dog's certification card to hand, as issued by the association responsible for training.</p>	<input type="checkbox"/>

EQUIPMENT	<p>Ensure you have all the necessary equipment for your dog and its needs, such as a leash, water container and suitable food.</p>	<input type="checkbox"/>
ON ARRIVAL	<p>Never disembark from the flight if the staff responsible for checking your dog's documents are not with you, even if this means having to wait on board.</p>	<input type="checkbox"/>
